We (Miss B and I) of course met the trains the same as Monday before, but were again doomed to disappointment, but you probably are enjoying yourself better than you would here.

Ada has ^{had} two tragedies within the past week. one a young man from north of town a short distance was killed by some horsemen last week. The other, a student J. S. Weaver of Montgomery Co. shot and killed himself yesterday. so you can have an

idea of the excitement.

It is now 9.05 P.M. have been studying a short time, since Military, are somewhat tired, so will close. Will look for you Monday but if you think you can't come then, if possible write, so will get the letter Sunday, but if you expect to come this will be unnecessary.

Sardon short letter as I am sleepy. Oh no I have not been homesick but something very nearly like it will explain later.
